3. Resources Needed

- Grants
- Municipal support
- Machinery (private investment/grants)
- Shipping (tax-cut for environmental shipping, paid by municipality)
- Tourism tax (transparently managed)

- To start get money from grants
- Link actual recycling (metal and glass) to include plastic
- Give out free chairs (200 bottles = 1 chair)

HARVESTING OF MARINE SPECIES

1. What is the activity/solution?

- Signs in dive shops and hotels telling customers what seafood to avoid and why
- Information for cruise ships on what not to purchase
- Scientific study on endangered areas (what to protect and when)

2. Who will be involved and what role will they play?

- Dive operations and affiliated hotels; snorkel and kayak operators; marine park and patrol
- Coral Reef Alliance and marine park; municipality (signs)
- Steve Box; Reef Check; volunteer instructors; media/luncheons

3. Resources needed

- Money
- Volunteers
- Supplies

4. Next Steps

- Make signs
- Make signs and have CORAL contact cruise ships and network
- Brochures for cruise ships from USAID-MIRA
- Marine park representative to visit cruise ship dock to look at existing resources
- Mass mail universities (liaison with Steve Box)

LACK OF EDUCATION AND AWARENESS

1. What is the activity/solution?

- Create free, easily accessible, easily understandable informational material in all streams of media (internet, signs, DVD, pamphlet, posters, radio, newspapers, magazines all multilingual)
- Must be multi-leveled (reach children, locals, marine recreation providers/users, developers, real estate agents, advertisers, etc.)
- Monthly information workshops with "certificates of completion"

2. Who will be involved and what role will they play?

- All marine recreation users/providers must be involved
- Children in public and private schools (hence teachers)
- Transportation providers: water/car taxis, bus drivers
- Municipality
- Sandy Bay and West End Marine Reserve (provide informational meetings for taxi drivers, tour guides, other marine recreation providers)
- Hotel owners post pamphlets
- Glass bottom boat tours

3. Resources Needed

- Money
- Government interest and involvement
- Time
- Volunteers

4. Next Step

- Propaganda!
- Identify definite participants: get commitments
- Roatan Bruce "The Reef Minute" pitch (Five 2 minute announcements)
- Attack plan: Approaching schools (2 classes per month)
- Posting signs in each dive shop, airport, ferry, etc.
- Education/communication committee (centralized effort of outreach)

LACK OF ENFORCEMENT

1. What is the activity/solution?

• Identify the actual laws and regulations of the area and simplify procedures to make them understandable at all levels (municipality, community, tourism industry)

2. Who will be involved and what role will they play?

• Associations will be involved: BICA, UMA, teachers, patrol rangers, judges, police
